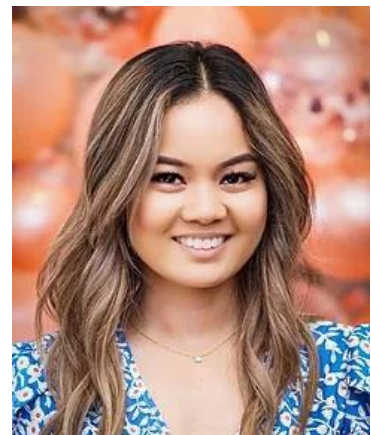

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DAY

GIRL SCOUTS DAY

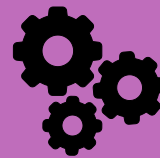

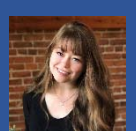

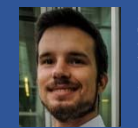
